A very successful first Greater El Morro Area Fiber Crafts meeting took place at the Old School Gallery on Sunday November 16. Twenty-one fiber artists and would-be fiber artists attended a productive session directed at envisioning the future of fiber arts in our area. By the end of the meeting several workshops were scheduled.

(See Pages 1-3 for Quilting, Spinning, Basketry and Tanning workshops.)

Future workshops planned include knitting, crocheting, weaving, felting, rug braiding, embroidery, and raffia hats.

The plan is for each workshop to evolve into a group of fiber crafts people (e.g. spinning group, quilting group) who would continue to meet on a regular basis in order to support one another and, together as a group, improve our skills. If you're already skilled in your fiber art and would like to take part, or have any questions, contact Kate Wilson at 505-783-4704 so we can put you in touch with the relevant group.

Participants were eager to explore many avenues for promoting fiber arts and fiber artists. There were many ideas: expanding fiber demonstrations at the EMAAC Fiber Festival; becoming part of the New Mexico Fiber Arts Trail--a statewide reference to all the fiber artists in New Mexico; for representatives of our fiber group to attend festivals in Taos and Farmington, and Mountain Man Rendezvous; starting a fiber library; helping artists sell their craft; sending artists to workshops; bringing fiber artists here to teach workshops; and starting fiber programs in the local schools. The Ramah Farmers' Market expressed interest in sponsoring fiber arts during the market season and at the Harvest Festival.

FOURTH ANNUAL YOUNG WRITERS CONTEST HELD IN NOVEMBER

Having, at the last minute, taken over the Young Writers Contest, I wasn't entirely sure how it would turn out. I whipped up flyers, entry forms, and teacher's packets, got them to the schools, recruited judges, and with a couple of days left until the deadline and zero entries, I thought the whole thing would be a flop. And then, miraculously, entries in all four categories (poetry, non fiction short story, fiction short story, and personal narrative) started pouring in and grew to a remarkable number of 170 from seven local schools: Ramah Elementary School, Ramah High School, Zuni High School, Zuni Middle School, A:Shiwi Elementary School, Pine Hill Elementary School, and Pine Hill High School, as well as a couple of homeschool entries. Volunteer judges determined the winners. On November 22, we held a reception for all the writers, parents, teachers, and community members. Many students were there to receive their prizes and some read their pieces. It was an excellent turnout, and overall, the 2008 Young Writers Contest...SUCCESS! I can't wait until next year, when I hope to have more time to get an even better response!

On Sunday, Nov. 23, we enjoyed our first of two scheduled Chinese cooking classes, taught by "Chef Johnny Wok" and hosted by Zuni Mountain Sanctuary. We were treated to an afternoon and evening of fun and learning as we observed "Chef Johnny" knowledgeably prepare no less than 12 different scrumptious dishes. We began by tasting samples of the different single ingredients that he would be using during the cooking class. Johnny also had a nice selection of packaged noodles, seaweeds, dried black beans, dried turnip, dried tofu skin, chilies, and assorted produce for us to see and sample. We discussed the different equipment used to create Chinese food and practiced new chopping techniques on the produce that would be used in that evening's meal. We got a few of the dishes started on the stove as they needed to cook a little longer, but once the wok was fired up things began to move very rapidly. "Chef Johnny" was soon juggling two woks as well as three burners on the stove as he amazed us with back to back dishes sizzling spiritedly in very hot pans as mouth watering aromas filled the room. "Chef Johnny" informed me he is thinking about showing us how to make Dim Sum at the next class. The class is limited to 10 people so call soon. Bring plenty of notepaper and a pen for taking notes.
