Over the course of the 20th century, our food system has been co-opted by corporate forces whose interests do not lie in providing the public with fresh, healthy, and sustainably-produced food. Fortunately for America, an alternative emerged from the counter-culture of California in the late 1960s and early 1970's, where a group of political anti-corporate protesters voiced their dissent by creating a food chain outside of the conventional system.
