Willow Basket Workshop with Samuel Suina

SPECIAL EVENTS

Saturday, April 17 9:30 am - 4:30 pm, \$25

Samuel Suina, member of the Cochiti Pueblo, is a talented and experienced artist, author and instructor. He has worked at the Institute of American Indian Art and at NMSU. Sam tells us, "The basket weaving course will include storytelling and singing about the gift of the basket by the corn maidens to the Pueblo Indian people and to all that is living. The weaving of the basket will begin with harvesting of the sacred branches." Tools required for harvesting the willows are gloves and a sharp pocket



knife and/or clippers. Once harvested, the branches will be cleaned off and placed in three piles according to length. Then come the four stages of weaving: the base, the "bird house," braiding and finishing. Sam teaches, "The art of basket weaving provides an opportunity and an experience that allows for our creative spirit to simply flow from us and to come alive in the form of a blessed basket." Thursdays, April 15, 22 & 29, 7 pm \$15 for the 2-day workshop \$5 for 4/29 session.

Contact Improvisation is an engaging "full-body" contact approach to dance which began evolving in the 70's. CI promotes a multi-sensory awareness, and is certainly a communal dance experience! VanGuard will also introduce Crane Style Qi Gong as part of the workshop. Wear layered, loose clothing, and be prepared to dance barefoot. A special treat is offered the 3rd day of the series as Brian and Patrick Neher join VanGuard by performing live jazz as the backdrop to the dance improv session. Intarsia Knitting Class

Mara Stone, an experienced knitter and instructor, is offering a one day class teaching the technique called "Intarsia". She often teaches knitting at Village Wools in Albuquerque. Mara explains, "Intarsia is a method of knitting large areas of color in a garment or afghan. For example, ... when knitting a dinosaur on the front of a child's sweater or many flowers on a woman's sweater. The yarn is not carried across the row as it is in fairisle knitting, but either small butterflies of yarn or bobbins are used." This class is for experienced knitters.

Materials you need to bring: at least three colors of worsted weight yarn and a set of size 6 or 7 needles to learn technique. Mara will provide bobbins and knitters' graph paper. From the Executive Director

I am grateful to have had the chance to work with all of you, board members and artists especially, and to have had the pleasure to meet so many interesting and talented performers, visitors and community members. But I'm ready to take a leap of faith and see what's next in my life.
