



They will show journals that were shared with each member of the group as well as works of art for the table and wall. This year, the group has assembled a work for the wall which includes sections from each member. The theme for this work is "Route 66" and the proceeds from this piece will be donated to EMAAC. - Candace Lee



Visual journaling has existed throughout history as a process of reflective thinking, and as a record of image making. Throughout history great thinkers recorded and reflected on their ideas using a variety of visual journaling techniques. From Thomas Edison's light bulb sketches to Leonardo DaVinci's visual journals of flying machines to Stephen Hawking's space-time diagrams, this record of image making also served as a record of the thought process. Exploring the thought process through visual journaling is essential in a world that is in continuous change Da Vinci (1452-1519) carried a visual journal with him at all times so that he could record ideas, impressions, and observations as they occurred. His journals, of which seven thousand pages exist, contained observations and thoughts of scholars he admired, personal financial records, letters, reflections on domestic problems, philosophical musings and prophecies, plans for inventions, and treatises on anatomy, botany, geology, flight, water, drawings and paintings.

Community Notes

FAREWELL, DAVID WEBER

On August 20, Professor David J. Weber died at his summer home in Timberlake. He was internationally acknowledged to

be one of our nation's most distinguished historians. David wrote more than 20 books. Among those of special interest to New Mexico enthusiasts were *On the Edge of Empire, The Taos Hacienda of Los Martinez, The Mexican Frontier, 1821 to 1846, Trading in Santa Fe,* and *What Caused the Pueblo Revolt of 1680?* Perhaps his finest achievement was *The Spanish Frontier in North America* which was selected by the New York Times as a notable book of 1992 and was nominated for a Pulitzer Prize. David was knighted by order of the King of Spain and received Mexico's Order of the Aztec Eagle. David was talented, humble and humorous. Two weeks before his death, he gave a talk at the Gallery on his latest book. Our sincere sympathies to David's



WATER... OUR MOST PRECIOUS COMMODITY

The "village" of El Morro, including EMAAC (5%), Ancient Way Cafe and RV Park (51%), Inscription Rock Trading (22%) and property owners Lou and Billie Gross (22%) collectively get our water from a well north of the Gallery. We have recently begun meeting to address issues that impact all of us. All operating businesses have installed meters at our intake points, as the water is shared proportionately as shown above. We will ultimately install a meter at the well head, as a neighboring rancher is entitled to as much of the well production as the rest of us combined. We share the cost of electricity for the pump and have just worked with the NM Department of Transportation to replace a critical aging length of pipe which runs under the part of NM 53 currently under construction. The group now meets guarterly and Gerry Ackerman is EMAAC's representative on the Well Shareholders group. This is just one of those arcane, but vital, complications of making the Gallery work, and an excellent example of our community's commitment to mutual cooperation. - HL

The Regional Food Hub that we are trying to develop is a new concept that is popular in Washington, but we are currently caught between new ideas and old guidelines. In July we met with New Mexico USDA Director Terry Brunner. He is looking into options and programs to see if He can find a "fit" for our project. We have also been in contact with Senator Bingamen's office for assistance and support. It is with optimism that we move forward. We believe that the right property and funding will become available and that this community will soon have a co-op food hub that will bring quality food to our area.
