In 2007, during a conversation with a gallery artist in Madrid NM (then a stranger) Liz, I found myself saying, "I used to be an artist, but now I'm just an art appreciator." This sparked a dialog with Liz about why that would be. Originally I was commissioning her to make a clay statue of The Singing Woman: keeper of the ancestor's bones, the guardian of the Spirit. Each Singing Woman holds in her hands an object designed for a special need, dream, or desire: a healing object for the receiver. After the dialog Liz said: I will make you a Singing Woman but she will be holding a 2 inch by 2 inch quilt that you will make. This simple task launched the beginning of my journey home, and, eventually, to a crossroads for me and my husband, Jon. The tiny quilt took 2 months to complete. Four months after Singing Woman arrived Jon and I met the Zuni Mountain Poets. Soon we took a leap of faith moving to Ramah, building a new life with new friends in an unique community with a focus on the arts. I have been quilting my "new", self-taught way ever since. Although heavily rooted in traditional quilting with it's original emphasis on form AND function and the use of materials on hand, I design most of my quilts as I go along. I often work without patterns, shun the quilt police and relying on spontaneity. "'If it's too long, cut some off; if it's too short, add some on!" These quilts embrace imperfection as part of the inner truth, color, and fun in a modern blend of old and new.



THE GIN GAME

a play by D.L. Coburn directed by Eden Gloria November 7 - 10 8pm

This winner of the 1978 Pulitzer Prize uses a game as a metaphor for life. Weller Martin is playing solitaire on the porch of a seedy nursing home. Enter Fonsia Dorsey, a prim, self-righteous lady. They discover they both dislike the home and enjoy gin rummy, so they begin to play and to reveal intimate details of their lives. Fonsia wins every time and their secrets become weapons used against one another. Weller longs for a victory to counter a lifetime of defeats, but it doesn't happen. He leaves the stage a broken man, and Fonsia realizes her self-righteous rigidity has led to an embittered, lonely old age.

This play will be presented at the Old School Gallery featuring Susan McNabb as Fonsia Dorsey and Donald Sharp as Weller Martin under the direction of Eden Gloria.

Show dates are Wednesday November 7th thru Saturday, November 10th. Curtain will be at 8p.m. each night. Ticket price \$12.00. (At this writing, a matinee on Sunday the 12th at 2pm has been penciled in but we well have to let you know for sure at a later time.)

Ramah Farmers' Market Harvest Festival and Ancient Way Fall Festival

The 7th annual Ramah Farmers' Market Harvest Festival will join forces again this year with the Ancient Way Fall Festival. On Saturday, October 6 the Market will move from its present location on Lewis Street in Ramah and instead set up under the tent in front of the Ancient Way Café. The Market will open at its usual time of 10:00 am, with all its usual produce and craft vendors, and will run all the way to 4:00 PM. We will continue to sell produce until it runs out.

Returning from last year will by the RFM Harvest Festival events including the (7th Annual) Homestead Harvest Display and Pie Contest and Pie Auction — at I2 noon, and the (5th Annual) Beautiful Chicken Contest. New this year is the Garden Display exhibit, and a new category for the pie contest — the Homesteader Pie.

Like last year, all the livestock displays (including the chicken contest) will be across the street, under the trees beside the El Morro Feed and Seed building. This year the livestock displays will include a new rabbit display as well as sheep, goats and alpacas. Set up besides the livestock display will be a wool spinning demonstration.

The Ramah Farmers' Market which will be set up under the big tent in front of the Ancient Way Café, will also be featuring their usual vendors selling produce, baked goods and crafts. The Ancient Way Café will be featuring a barbecue at the new food tent along with other local food vendors.
