400 Years of Music for the Guitar

Classical guitarist, John Siqueiros, will present an evening of works for classical guitar spanning a period of 400 years. John will perform pieces by the 16th century Italian lutenist, Francesco da Milano, a suite for lute by J. S. Bach, and arrangements of character pieces by the romantic Spanish pianist, Isaac Albeniz. The second half of the program will feature works written for the guitar by 20th Century Latin American composers Heitor Villa Lobos from Brazil, Cuban guitarist Leo Brouwer, and Agustin Barrios from Uruguay.


