

# **Gregg Daigle Band**

#### Continued

Gregg Daigle's own life has taken him from the bustle of the Northeast to the serene vistas of New Mexico; his musical journey has seen him travel similarly wide expanses. Like many pickers, it was rock n' roll that initially put a guitar in Gregg's hands; a keen ear and an open mind eventually led him to explore a varied cross-section of the acoustic music landscape, from classical to Gypsy jazz. However, it was the rootsy sounds of Bill Monroe and bluegrass that would leave the deepest mark, evident in the strains of acoustic guitar, banjo, and mandolin that abound throughout all twelve tracks of *Seize the Hay*.

The Gregg Daigle Band represents a true convergence of these seemingly disparate musical paths. Drummer Carlin Venaglia and bassist Jon McMillan provide a solid rhythmic foundation upon which Gregg and keyboardist/vocalist Chris Plourde build robust melodies and harmonies – music that is at once instantly accessible but replete with hidden nuances that reward repeated listening. The title track is a case in point. The story is familiar – a Midwestern family working hard to keep the farm productive. Through thoughtful dynamics and a seamless blending of acoustic and electric tones, the band infuses the lyrics with a sense of time and space. Days turn to nights. Seasons pass. Children grow. Gotta make hay.

With or without lyrics, The Gregg Daigle Band always has a story to tell. Instrumental compositions like "Twenty-Nine Wishes" and "River Dogs" provide not only a showcase for the band's understated virtuosity, but a sonic vision of places visited and lives lived. Guitar, banjo, and keys weave a rich musical tapestry that never meanders, endeavoring to connect with fellow musicians and casual listeners alike.

Like the ramblers, workers, and families it depicts, *Seize the Hay* is the product of minds and souls in motion -a band on a journey, eager to share the sights and sounds of a life well lived.

In this *Playshop* we shall explore the essence of the Creative Process and the use of improvisational techniques borrowed from a Performing Arts perspective couched within the Philosophy of Taoism as a means of exploring and igniting one's own creative potential.

While creativity is often thought of as an Artistic process, here we will explore creativity as problem solving. As such the tenets of creativity may be applied to virtually and problem or challenge. Sources to be explored include ideas from Rollo May's *The Courage to Create*, Eric Maisels's, *Coaching the Artistic Within* and Austin Klein's, *Steal Like an Artist*, as well as Stephen Mitchell's translation of Lao Tzu's, *Tao Te Ching*.

Please bring a sketch book of at least 9 x 12, pencils and a box of crayons. Wear loose comfortable clothing in which you wouldn't mind rolling about on the floor as we will be doing some movement exploration and breathing techniques.

Gregory received his MFA in Dance from Temple University and has taught Creative Process to youth and adults in a variety of educational forums.

#### Fair Isle Knitted Bag Class w/ Betty Moon

Location: Plaza Del Sol April 5 @ 10 AM to 12 PM April 26, May 10 &24, June 7 &21 @ 12 PM to 2 PM \$30 for the class



The class project will be a simple Fair Isle bag. It will start with a provisional cast-on and will be knitted in the round, from the bottom up. Once the bag is finished, the bottom will be grafted together or a bottom can be knitted on. There will be variations for the strap(s) as well. The bag will be lined, so that the floats won't be able to be snagged when in use. The purpose of the class is to learn how to control the tension with yarn held in both hands, so that you can have a smooth fabric.
