FIT 4X4

Wednesdays at Noon

This is a fitness program that targets four areas: arms, legs, abdominals and balance/flexibility. It incorporates movements from Yoga, Pilates, Dance and Basic Calisthenics. The reason for the name (4x4): a movement for each target area will be done four times (sets) as follows: 30 seconds for the movement itself, 15 seconds dance and 15 seconds of rest (all timed).

Each movement will include modifications for three levels (or more, depending upon the ability and desire of the student). As the student progresses, he/she may wish to incorporate weights into the movements.

After an initial introduction (approximately 5 minutes), there will be a 5-10 minute warm-up, followed by a 16 minute exercise incorporating the four areas described above. Note that this may vary depending upon the students' abilities and the trainer's one-one assistance. A timer will be in attendance to ensure correct time spent on each exercise.

A cool-down of 5-8 minutes will follow, ending with a 10-12 minute stretch session, including floor work. The entire program will be approximately 50 minutes.

This will be fun! We can work together to attain a degree of physical fitness that will promote a healthy and happy life. Josie Parry
