**Gallup Students' Visit**

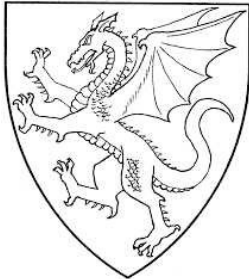
Deer Roberts showed students from Andy Stravers' class at Rehoboth Christian School around the Gallery speaking with knowledge and enthusiasm.

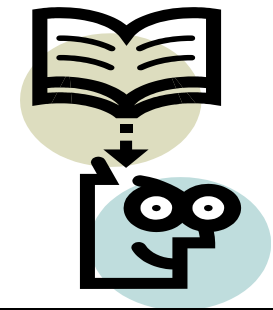
**A Special Invitation to Participate**

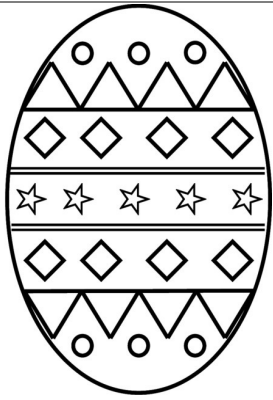

## BYOP (Bring Your Own Pattern) Lace Knitting Group

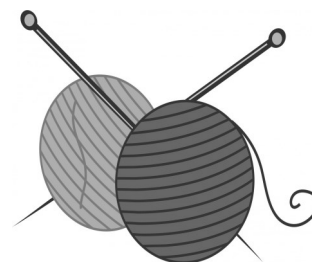
This group is for Beginner to Expert Lace Knitters. Each person supplies their own yarn, needles and pattern. If you are a beginner you can get help
