

Exhibition openings are in salon format and all exhibitors are encouraged to participate. Exhibiting artists are asked to bring finger foods to share.



Across the Great Divide: A Visual Journey Through Time and Space to the Communes of Northern New Mexico and Southern Colorado By Roberta Price

Sponsored by the New Mexico Humanities Council At the Old School Gallery

When: April 30 at 7:30 p.m.



Roberta Price presents an illustrated talk that takes us into the late 1960's and 70's communal living experiments in northern New Mexico and southern Colorado. Come and learn about the outlook and everyday life of these communes whose ultimate goals were often called "utopian" in their scope. Price was a student of these movements who also became an observing participant. The talk also places these experiments in the context of earlier such movements in American history. Slides will accompany the talk and an exhibition of photographs will be in the gallery during the weeks leading up to the talk. Don't miss Roberta Price's unique insights into this important part of New Mexico's past. How much of these visions survive in various forms even today?
