Bob Shafer put in an electrical line from the gallery to the stage, with Eddie's labor donated by Will Stripp and the backhoe use donated by Davis Ranch. Thanks to both. This was a huge undertaking--so "Thank You Bob" for all those mornings in the hot sun filling in the trench and putting in the line. Thanks also to the other people who worked hard this quarter: Amy Renaud, for clear and precise bookkeeping, Barbara Duncan and the docents, and Kirk Shoemaker for tech/internet.

We received our annual grant from New Mexico Arts which will help fund programs, festivals and gallery operations for the coming year. We have also received generous donations from members. We are in great shape, with plans to paint the gallery, repair/ paint roof, and have dreams of landscaping and making the gallery more visible and beautiful.
