Chip Thomas **The Painted Desert Project** Coming to The Old School Gallery Saturday, October 22, 2-4 pm

The El Morro Area Arts Council is very pleased to announce Chip Thomas, aka "jetsonorama", regarding his Painted Desert Project in Arizona.

The Painted Desert Project is a series of large scale photographs pasted along roadsides, on cattle tanks and on abandoned buildings in the northern Arizona desert. These murals aim to reflect the love and appreciation, of the rich history shared by the Navajo people, back to Navajo people.

Chip Thomas is a photographer, public artist and physician who has been working between Monument Valley and The Grand Canyon on the Navajo Nation since 1987. Thomas was a 2018 recipient of a Kindle Project gift and in 2020 was one of a handful of artists chosen by the UN to recognize the 75th anniversary of the United Nations' founding.

DE MUERIOS OPEN MIC AND CELEBRATION



CHESTER NEZ: World War II Navajo Code Talker



Saturday November 19th 2-4 pm

Presented by author Judith Avila with Latham Nez, grandson of Chester Nez

When Judith Avila met the late Chester Nez in 2007, she realized he had a compelling story.

Although 420 Navajo code talkers served in the Marines during World War II, none had written memoirs until Nez's 2012 autobiography Code Talker. Chester Nez(1921-2014) was one of the original 29 code talkers; men who developed the only unbroken code in modern warfare and took it into battle against the Japanese. His life demonstrated how challenges enhance strength and how diversity augments the strength of a nation.
