

Butoh is a modern Japanese dance practice that has gone worldwide as a creative tool. It uses poetic cues to catapult the senses and imagination. Moving meditations are done lying, sitting, standing, walking and stretching. Each relaxing and strengthening class includes tasks that challenge our senses, explores patterns and range of movement, and most importantly creates an artist's trance that connects us with deep meaning. It can bring a wealth of inspiration to all kinds of artists, not just movement artists. Each class is a guided journey.

Wear clothes you are comfortable in and don't mind getting dirty. The course series will culminate in an optional performance geared toward "bringing blessings" to our community using creative contemplation. Let's get to work!
